





Preliminary FY2015 Report: Historical Compliance Past 10 Fiscal Years






Overall General Compliance FY2006-FY2015













- Risk assessment applies in drug, fraud, & larceny cases
- Offender must meet eligibility criteria
 - Recommended for incarceration
 - No current or violent felony conviction
 - Did not distribute an ounce or more of cocaine
 - Not convicted of crime requiring mandatory minimum term of incarceration
- Purpose: To recommend alternative sanctions for offenders who are statistically less likely to recidivate
- Type of alternative at discretion of judge











Sentencing Revocation Reports Received by Type of Violation and Sanction Received FY2015 (Preliminary)





Probation Violation Guidelines Cases – "Technicals" by Type of Original Offense FY2015 (Preliminary)




Types of Violations Cited in Probation Violation Guidelines Cases – "Technicals" FY2015 (Preliminary)






