


Preliminary FY2016 Report Judicial Agreement with Guideline Recommendations


General Compliance:

The degree to which judges agree with the type of sanction recommended.




Durational Compliance:


















Sentencing Revocation Reports Received for Technical and New Law Violations* FY1998 - FY2016 (Preliminary)
