The amendment, passed by the General Assembly in 2022, now allows the VCSC to recommend enhancements based on practice instead of the initial enhancements imposed by statute.

§ 17.1-805.1. Discretionary sentencing guideline midpoints for certain defendants. — The Commission shall adopt discretionary felony sentencing guidelines that may increase the midpoint of the recommended sentencing range based on the defendant's record of convictions for violent felony offenses, as defined in subsection C of § 17.1-805.

For guidelines that become effective on or after July 1, 2022, the Commission may increase the midpoint of the recommended sentencing range for such defendants as set forth in subsection A of § 17.1-805 or the Commission may recommend increases in the midpoint to the degree indicated by historical data for felony offenses sentenced in the Commonwealth. Any recommendations adopted by the Commission to modify the sentencing guidelines midpoints shall be contained in the annual report required under § 17.1-803 and shall become effective in accordance with § 17.1-806. (2022, cc. 723, 783.)





- § 18.2-51.7 Genital mutilation (Class 2 felony);
- § 18.2-55.1 Bodily injury caused by hazing (Class 1 misdemeanor);
- § 18.2-64.2 Carnal knowledge by law enforcement officer, DOC staff, bondsman, etc. (Class 6 felony);
- § 18.2-144.1 Killing or severely injuring law enforcement animal (Class 5 felony);
- § 18.2-308.5 Manufacture, transfer, or possess plastic firearm (Class 5 felony); and
- § 18.2-308.5:1 Manufacture, transfer, or possess trigger activator (Class 6 felony).

HB2456 would have removed the following:




§ 18.2-152.7. Personal trespass by computer; penalty. —

A. A person is guilty of the crime of personal trespass by computer when he uses a computer or computer network to cause physical injury to an individual.

B. If committed maliciously, the crime of personal trespass by computer shall be punishable as a Class 3 felony. If such act is done unlawfully but not maliciously, the crime of personal trespass by computer shall be punishable as a Class 6 felony. (1984, c. 751; 1985, c. 322; 2003, cc. 987, 1016; 2005, cc. 746, 761, 827.)

History: 2003 -Increased Unlawfully from Class 1 Misdemeanor to Class 6 Felony; 2005 - Removed "without authority and with the intent" from Paragraph A
