#### Nonviolent Offender Risk Assessment Background

#### § 17.1-803

- **5.** Develop an offender risk assessment instrument for use in all felony cases, based on a study of Virginia felons, that will be predictive of the relative risk that a felon will become a threat to public safety.
- **6.** Apply the risk assessment instrument to offenders convicted of any felony that is not specified in (i) subdivision 1, 2 or 3 of subsection A of § 17.1-805 or (ii) subsection C of § 17.1-805 under the discretionary sentencing guidelines, and shall determine, on the basis of such assessment and with due regard for public safety needs, the feasibility of achieving the goal of placing **25 percent** of such offenders in one of the alternative sanctions listed in subdivision 4. If the Commission so determines that achieving the **25 percent** or a higher percentage goal is feasible, it shall incorporate such goal into the discretionary sentencing guidelines, to become effective on January 1, 1996. If the Commission so determines that achieving the goal is not feasible, the Commission shall report that determination to the General Assembly, the Governor and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Virginia on or before December 1, 1995, and shall make such recommendations as it deems appropriate.


#### Revised Risk Assessment Tool Needed

- Statistical Analyses suggest:
  - Prior adult felony convictions factor in the current model is not significant.
  - Legally restrained factor in the current model is not significant.
  - Some Judicial Circuits (Norfolk, Chesterfield, and Henrico and demographic factors in the model found to have significant effects on recidivism –later used to readjust the scoring point in the final risk assessment tool.)

## Recommended Assessment Tool

- Age
  - If older than 43 years: 1 point
  - If age 30-43 years: 4 points
  - If age 21-29 years: 5 points
  - If age younger than 21 years: 11 points
- Prior Adult Incarcerations
  - 1-9 prior incarcerations: 4 points
  - 10 or more prior incarcerations: 6 points

## Recommended Assessment Tool (continue)

- Prior adult person felony convictions:
  - If Yes, assign 2 points.
- Criminal arrest within 12 months (prior to current offense date)
  - If Yes, assign 4 points.

 Total score <= 7 would be recommended for alternative punishment.

If answered **YES** to **ANY**, go to "Nonviolent Risk Assessment Recommendations" on cover sheet and check Not Applicable. If answered **NO** to **ALL**, complete remainder of Section D worksheet.

## Recommended Assessment Tool

- The recommended assessment tool recommends:
  - Around 27% of the offenders for alternative punishment.
- Recidivism rate for offenders recommended for alternative punishment in the proposed model: 16%

- Some other factors to consider (based on the current literature)
  - Family relationship (Case Details Worksheet)
  - Residential Instability (Case Details Worksheet)
  - Substance Abuse (Case Details Worksheet)
  - Antisocial Attitudes
  - Antisocial Personality Pattern
  - Criminal Peer Networks
  - Poor performance in past work/education
