




General Compliance

The degree to which judges agree with the type of sanction recommended.



 - To extend the upper end of the guidelines recommendation for sex offenders who are statistically more likely to recidivate
- Enhancements
 - Level 1
 - 300% Increase in upper end of guidelines range
 - Level 2
 - 100% Increase in upper end of guidelines range
 - Level 3
 - 50% Increase in upper end of guidelines range
