



The degree to which judges agree with the type of sanction recommended.






- Rape & Other Sexual Assault Guidelines

- Enhancements

 - 300% Increase in upper end of guidelines range
 - Level 2
 - 100% Increase in upper end of guidelines range
 - Level 3
 - 50% Increase in upper end of guidelines range
















Participation in criminal act to benefit gang--no juvenile member (n=16)
