Primary Offense Remaining Counts (Number of Counts)

Calculate the total number of remaining counts for the primary offense that were not scored under the Primary Offense factor above. Then locate that total within the applicable range and record the corresponding point value.

Additional Offenses Counts (Number of Counts)

Select the appropriate block based on the primary offense.

Additional offenses are offenses included in the same sentencing event as the primary offense but assigned a different VCC (Virginia Crime Code) than the primary offense.

Count the total number of additional offense counts. Then locate this total within the appropriate range on the scoring table and record the corresponding score.

Prior Felony Convictions/Adjudications Against a Person

Determine whether the defendant has at least one prior adult conviction or juvenile adjudication for a felony person offense in their prior record. Qualifying offenses include those with VCC prefixes “ASL” (except use of firearm), “FAM,” “MUR,” “KID,” “ROB,” “RAP,” or “SEX.”

Note: Some offenses with other VCC prefixes—such as certain burglary offenses (e.g., BUR-2215-F2)—also qualify as felony person offenses. Refer to Appendix E for the complete list of person crimes.

Mandatory Minimum in Current Event

This factor is not scored if the Primary Offense is S: Fraudulently Obtaining Welfare Assistance \$1000 or more (FRD-2695-F9) (§ 63.2-522).

For all other offenses, assign points only if at least one offense (primary or additional offense) in the current sentencing event carries a mandatory minimum penalty. Refer to Appendix B or the VCC book for offenses that carry mandatory minimum time. The conviction must be part of the current sentencing event.

If multiple offenses in the event carry mandatory minimum penalties, do not add the points together. Assign the points only once, based on the presence of any qualifying offense in the event.

Prior Incarcerations/Commitments

This factor is not scored if the Primary Offense is S: Fraudulently Obtaining Welfare Assistance \$1000 or more (FRD-2695-F9) (§ 63.2-522).

Enter points if the offender has one or more periods of incarceration resulting from a sentence (i.e., an effective jail or prison sentence). Count any incarceration sentence the offender has served or is currently serving, including boot camp, diversion center, detention center, or CCAP. Also include commitments to juvenile institutions or post-dispositional confinement in secure detention following an adjudication of delinquency. Do not score pre-trial or pre-sentence custody unless the offender was sentenced to time served.

Legally Restrained at Time of Offense

Enter points if the defendant was under any of the following forms of supervision or legal obligation at the time of the offense. Do not rely solely on the catchwords to score this factor. Refer to the General Instructions for definitions.

Parole: The defendant was under an obligation to a parole board on the date of the offense.

Post-Release: The defendant was under post-release supervision or probation as defined in §§ 19.2-295.2 or 18.2-10 on the date of the offense.

Supervised Probation after Incarceration: The defendant was on state, federal, or local supervised probation on the date of the offense after serving time in jail or prison.

Supervised Probation: The defendant was on state, federal, or local supervised probation on the date of the offense after receiving a probation sentence with no active incarceration.

Other: The defendant had another court-ordered obligation or was in violation of a restriction imposed by a court or administrative body on the date of the offense that is not defined above (e.g., a condition of good behavior).

Go to the next appropriate section.

If the total score is “11” or less the guidelines sentence is Probation/No Incarceration. If the total score is “12” or more go to Fraud Section C.

Primary Offense Remaining Counts (Statutory Maximums):

Using the statutory maximum penalty, assign points to each count of the primary offense not already scored under the Primary Offense factor above. Sum the points for all such counts and record the total.

Additional Offenses (Statutory Maximums):

Additional offenses are offenses included in the same sentencing event as the primary offense but assigned a different VCC (Virginia Crime Code) than the primary offense. Identify each additional offense and its statutory maximum penalty. Assign points to each count of the additional offense based on the statutory maximum penalty. After assigning points to all additional offenses and their counts, total the points and record the total.

Type of Additional Offense:

Enter the appropriate points if the current sentencing event includes an additional felony offense with a VCC prefix of "ASL," "FAM," "ROB," or "WPN". If more than one qualifying offense is present, do not total the points. Assign points only once, based on the VCC prefix with the highest point value.

Mandatory Minimum in Current Event:

Assign points to each additional offense that carries a mandatory minimum penalty listed on the worksheet and enter the total points. Appendix B and the VCC book identify offenses that carry the required mandatory minimum term for a completed act.

Victim Injury:

Score this factor if any victim sustained an injury classified as Threatened, Emotional, Physical, Serious Physical, or Life-Threatening. This factor applies to injuries resulting from any offense included in the sentencing event, not only the primary offense.

The listed injury terms are catchwords used to group injury categories and do not define the injuries themselves for Sentencing Guidelines purposes. Injury scores must be assigned according to the specific definitions provided in the General Instructions, rather than the catchwords Threatened, Emotional, Physical, Serious Physical, or Life-Threatening.

Prior Incarceration/Commitment

Determine the score based on the sentencing event with the greatest effective time to be served. Count any incarceration sentence the offender has served or is currently serving, including boot camp, diversion center, detention center, or CCAP. Also include commitments to juvenile institutions or post-dispositional confinement in secure detention following an adjudication of delinquency. Calculate the total effective sentence to be served for each sentencing event. Do not score pre-trial or pre-sentence custody unless the offender was sentenced to time served.

Assign the appropriate points for "Less Than 12 Months" if the individual has served, or is currently serving, an effective sentence of 1 day to less than 12 months at the time of sentencing. Score CCAP as less than 12 months.

Assign the appropriate points for "1 Year (12 Months) or More" if the individual has served, or is currently serving, an effective sentence of 1 year or more at the time of sentencing. For scoring purposes, 12 months is equivalent to 1 year. If multiple offenses from a single sentencing event result in a combined effective sentence of 12 months or more, assign points even if no single offense received a sentence of 12 months or more.

Legally Restrained at Time of Offense

Score this factor based on the type of legal restraint that is assigned the most points. Enter points if the defendant was under any of the following forms of supervision or legal obligation at the time of the offense. Do not rely solely on the catchwords to score this factor. Refer to the General Instructions for definitions.

Parole: The defendant was under an obligation to a parole board on the date of the offense.

Post-Release: The defendant was under post-release supervision or probation as defined in §§ 19.2-295.2 or 18.2-10 on the date of the offense.

Supervised Probation after Incarceration: The defendant was on state, federal, or local supervised probation on the date of the offense after serving time in jail or prison.

Supervised Probation: The defendant was on state, federal, or local supervised probation on the date of the offense after receiving a probation sentence with no active incarceration.

Other: The defendant had another court-ordered obligation or was in violation of a restriction imposed by a court or administrative body on the date of the offense that is not defined above (e.g., a condition of good behavior).

Record the guidelines sentence.

Refer to the Fraud Section C Recommendation Table which follows these instructions to convert the total score to the guidelines sentence. Then, go to Section D Nonviolent Risk Assessment and follow the instructions. When completing the cover sheet, record the guidelines recommendation from Section C (midpoint and range) AND the Nonviolent Risk Assessment recommendation from Section D.

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Fraud/Section C

Ineligibility Conditions

Answer all four questions.

A. Was the offender recommended for probation/no incarceration on Section A? If an offender is not recommended for at least 1 day of incarceration check the “Yes” box.

B. Are any prior record offenses violent (Category I/II listed in Appendix A)? Refer to Appendix A of this manual for Category I and II offenses. If the offender’s prior record includes at least one adult conviction or juvenile adjudication prior to the date of sentencing for the instant offense, for any completed, attempted or conspired offense listed in Appendix A, check the “Yes” box.

C. Are any of the offenses at sentencing violent (Category I/II listed in Appendix A)? Refer to Appendix A of this manual for Category I and II offenses. Identify all the offenses that are being scored on the current worksheet as either a primary offense or an additional offense. If any of these completed, attempted or conspired offenses are listed in Appendix A, check the “Yes” box.

D. Do any of the offenses at sentencing require a mandatory term of incarceration? Refer to Appendix B of this manual for offenses with mandatory minimums. If any of the offenses in the current sentencing event require a mandatory term of incarceration, check the “Yes” box.

E. Did the offense occur while serving a state-responsible sentence? If any offense(s) at sentencing were committed while serving a state-responsible sentence of one year or more, check the “Yes” box.

If the answer to any of the questions is yes, do not score the remaining factors on this worksheet. Go to the cover sheet and fill out the Sentencing Guidelines Recommendation from Section A or C and check “Not Applicable” under the Nonviolent Risk Assessment section.

Offender Age at Time of Offense

If there are multiple offenses for which the offender is being sentenced, select the offense that occurred first. If the offender uses multiple birth dates, try to determine the correct date through medical, school or social security records. If still unable to determine the correct birth date, err on behalf of the defendant and use the offender’s oldest reported age.

Prior Adult Incarcerations

Score this factor if the offender has been sentenced to an active incarceration period in jail or prison prior to the date of sentencing for the instant offense. The incarceration period must be the result of an adult sentence. Do not score time spent in jail awaiting arraignment, trial or sentencing unless the offender is sentenced to “time served”. Score sentences to boot camp, diversion centers, detention centers and CCAP as periods of incarceration. Count multiple jail sentences ordered to run consecutively or concurrently to each other as only one incarceration period. The offender must be at liberty between periods of incarceration to score multiple periods.

Prior Adult Felony Person Convictions

Identify any prior person felony convictions in the offender’s criminal record. A prior conviction is any offense, other than the instant offense(s), for which the offender was convicted before the current sentencing event. Offenses that are pending sentencing in another court are considered prior convictions, even if the offense occurred after the instant offense.

Score all prior person convictions and out-of-state person convictions based on Virginia’s current penalty structure. If an offense is a misdemeanor in another state but is currently classified as a felony in Virginia, score it as a felony. The same rules used to score prior record factors on Worksheets A and C also apply when determining felony convictions for this factor.

Determine whether the defendant has at least one prior adult conviction for a felony person offense in the prior record. This includes juveniles who were certified and convicted as adults for a person offense. Qualifying offenses include those with the following VCC prefixes: “ASL” (except use of firearm), “FAM,” “MUR,” “KID,” “ROB,” “RAP,” or “SEX”.

Note: Some offenses with other VCC prefixes—such as certain burglary offenses (e.g., BUR-2215-F2)—also qualify as felony person offenses. Refer to Appendix E for the complete list of person crimes.

Prior Arrest or Confinement Within Past 12 Months (Prior to Offense)

Do not score arrests or confinements for criminal traffic misdemeanors or other traffic infraction offenses.

Score this factor if the offender was arrested as an adult or juvenile within 12 months prior to the date of the instant offense. If there are multiple offenses for which the offender is being sentenced, use the offense that occurred first. Do not score arrests for criminal traffic misdemeanors or other traffic infraction offenses (e.g., reckless driving, habitual offender, DWI, speeding, etc.). Summonses issued for non-traffic offenses within the past 12 months are also scored.

Also, score this factor if the offender was confined in prison or jail within the past 12 months from the date of the first offense. Include pretrial detention, participation in boot camp, detention center, diversion center and home incarceration through the jail or sheriff’s office. Home incarceration as a condition of probation is not scored. Do not score any periods of incarceration for criminal traffic misdemeanors or traffic infraction offenses (e.g., reckless driving, habitual offender, DWI, speeding, etc.).

Points are assigned even if the charges for which the offender was arrested or confined are concluded by a not guilty verdict, dismissed or nolle prossed.

Total Score

If the total score is 7 points or less, the guidelines will reflect a dual recommendation - the traditional period of incarceration and an alternative sanction. Check “Recommended for Alternative Punishment” on the cover sheet. If the total is 8 points or more, check “Not Recommended for Alternative Punishment.”

Go to the cover sheet and fill out the Sentencing Guidelines Recommendations and Nonviolent Risk Assessment sections. Record the recommendation from Section A or C and transfer the recommendation from Section D to the Nonviolent Risk Assessment section.
